Quarterly steering committee meetings are conducted with PHMs, AD Primary, NCPA, ECDO, ECCD coordinator, Master trainers, VCDC members and LMs to plan and discuss the progress of RPP program implementation through Lead Mother program approach. There are 20 members participated in this meeting.

Poverty is one of the main reasons for malnourishment. Action Unity provided livelihood Lanka support for 25 selected families with malnourished children from 7 Grama Niladari divisions. Each family received a dozen 3 month old chickens. PHMs explained to the negative impact of being a malnourished child and purpose of providing chicks. These families are selected through a selection criteria decided by Lead Mothers, PHM and AU Lanka Staff. The beneficiaries were recommended and approved by the DS Office staff.







Conducted awareness programs about hygiene education for parents / caregivers of preschoolers. The purpose of this program was to educate the parent of the children who comes to the Pre-School on the COVID-19 pandemic and also personal hygiene and protection measures to protect themselves and others from COVID-19 and other illness. This awareness program was hosted at the pre-school where the 1st COVID-19 positive case was identified. Other programs were conducted in two other areas that were identified as high risk areas by the MoH. The programs were implemented by AU Lanka, the MoH and an area PHI were invited to conduct these programs.







It is our responsibility to support and protect the front line Officers who serve the community during COVID 19 pandemic. Under the ongoing life stage program, Action Unity Lanka thought about this front line health officials and had discussion with MOH and SPHM and identified shortage of equipment to conduct the clinics regularly. As per the request, action Unity Lanka provided necessary tools and materials to continue their service to the pregnant mothers, mothers and children below 5 years in their service location. Hence 07 PHM clinic following necessary equipment which are Thermometer, Presser box, Tables, Dustbin, Forceps and Stationeries to keep weight records.







Personal hygiene is one of the prevention mechanisms to get protected from corona virus. Hence based on the request made by Zonal Director of Education, Action Unity Lanka took this initiative and provided hand washing unit to preschools in project locations. 19 Preschools got fixed modified complete set of hand washing unit at their preschool. This activity was implemented through the preschool management committees under the supervision of AU Lanka and AD -Preschool. Around 560 kids are benefiting from this activity.



Life Stage 2 targets children from ages 6 to 14, and all attention is on education and education facilities




"Letters and numbers are like the eyes of a human". Just like it is near impossible to move around without good eyesight, it is also difficult to lay the foundation to gain fundamental skills and success in life without knowledge of letters and numbers. Many childrens "Right to Education" is un fulfilled and they suffer due to the resulting poor literacy and numeracy skills. AU Lanka is trying to give the children of Puthukkudiyiruppu of the Mullaitivu district in Sri Lanka a chance to improve in their literacy and numeracy skill. Around 180 children attending such literacy and numeracy classes set up in 9 locations with the support of trained Community Volunteers.

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"Practice makes perfect". Regular exercise of an activity or skill is the way to become proficient in it. Our community volunteers constantly attend workshops, seminars and training sessions in order to develop their skills so as to be knowledgeable, confident and up to date when they deliver their services to the communities. AU Lanka presently has 14 community volunteers who receive regular training by professionals in areas like sponsor relation activities, mobilization and literacy & numeracy teaching.







"A New Door Opens" Opportunities need to be accessible in order to be successful. An example of this was when AU Lanka stepped forward to fulfill the request of the community of Vernavil. At a cost of over SLR. 450,000.00 AU Lanka was able to renovate and upgrade an existing building to function as a "Child Resource Center" The centre was provided with electricity, new furniture and a bright welcoming child friendly look. Community members gave their fullest support to this project Rural Development Society of Vernavil. This renovated building was officially declared open by CEO & PD of AU Lanka and handed over to the children of Vernavil on 29th April, 2021. Around 90 enrolled children along with their playmates now have a safe, child friendly space where they can spend their leisure time productively.





Life stage 3 or LS 3 has as its main focus youth from ages 16 to 24. Life skills and forms of sustainable vocational training are its main programs. These programs are implemented in Batticaloa.











The Water and Sanitation project, also called WATSAN for short was given 30 schools and communities who needed clean water and sanitation facilities. Priority was given to the schools and water spots for handwashing was provided. Some schools also received renovated toilet facilities



A dilapidated urinal unit at the school in Echanthivu was earmarked for full renovation. The building was renovated to house closed toilet units



Pipes were laid in Kothiyapula in order to supply clean water to the school in the area. The water pressure was also checked to ensure a stable supply of water



New water spot constructed at Navalkadu school





As a result of this work the students of the Govt school in Kothiyapulai are now able to get clean and uninterrupted water from the newly constructed water spot







Pupils of the Nellikadu GTMS received study packs from a donor. In addition they also received a new water spot with taps and clean water



The project is carried out as an Eco based youth led Disaster Risk Reduction project or Eco DRR for short



The pond which was Renovated by the youth led DRR team was handed over to the local farm organization. Renovation was funded by AU Lanka and the ceremony was held under the auspices of the Government Agent and AU Lanka



sustainable eco friendly livelihood materials in the form of fishing canoes were distributed to 8 selected fisher families

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A youth led DRR team from Manmunai West were given special training in providing child protection in emergency situations. The CIPE team passed the training successfully







One integral part of Eco based projects is gardening. Gardening implements and material for manufacturing compost was distributed to seven selected beneficiaries of the area.



Youth of the area educated on DRR procedures. One such training was emergency preparedness and response. Simulation techniques were used to help the youths to respond appropriately



GOLAH

This is an annual specific gift project which is funded by the donors. The Gift Of Love And Hope project is done in both Batticaloa and Puthukuditiruppu. This year Hand Washing stations were given to 31 centres in Batticaloa and 30 Puthukudiyiruppu
